<p><b>Extra Credit for the book:</b> Research the Alps. Explain either in a short paper or in a family presentation about where the Alps are located, what animals live there, how high the mountains are, etc. Due before taking the Final Exam.</p>	
<p><b>Characters:</b> Heidi, the main character, is a sweet, vivacious child who is the orphan of Adelheid and Tobias. The Alm-Uncle is Heidi’s grandfather who has a dark past. Everyone is afraid of him and gossips about him. Peter is a young boy who is the village goatherd. The grandmother is Peter’s grandmother. Aunt Dete is Heidi’s selfish aunt.</p>	
<b>HEIDI</b>	<p><b>Read Chapter 1 - Chapter 4.</b> Put this week’s vocabulary words in alphabetical order, look them up before reading each chapter, and write your own sentence for each. Read each chapter, then answer its study questions. <b>Written assignment:</b> Explain and give examples of the virtues Heidi has shown in these chapters. Do the written assignment on Thursday.</p>
<b>MON to WED</b>	<p><b>Read Chapter 1 – Chapter 4. Chapter 1.</b> Heidi, an orphan, is being taken by her aunt to live with her grandfather. The aunt makes Heidi wear all of her things for the very long, very steep walk. Heidi ends up stripping and leaving the clothes lying about in a pile on the mountainside. When Heidi unabashedly introduces herself, her grandfather is very surprised. He tells Heidi’s aunt that he did not know what to do with a child, but the aunt leaves her there in any case. <b>Chapter 2.</b> Heidi makes her bed in the hayloft of her grandfather’s hut. He feeds her and begins making things to make her more comfortable. <b>Chapter 3.</b> The grandfather sends Heidi off with Peter into the pastures to play. He gives Peter with a very generous portion of bread and cheese for her and instructions for Peter to watch her and to give her two bowls of milk later. <b>Chapter 4.</b> Heidi is no longer allowed to go up the mountain with Peter and soon the snows begin to fall.
